In a "Parenting" article in the June 8, 2015, edition of *The Kansas City Star*, Jim Cosgrove discussed the importance of knowing your neighbors. Cosgrove replied, "Sad, but true."

City Hall are The Heights Linden Square apartments; the Innovation Center at 69th and N. Oak is under construction; changes coming to Meadowbrook Shopping Center on N.E. Editorial

Can I still eat for \$31.50 a week?

In the July 2013 issue of Northaven Hills Newsletter I reported on a *Kansas City Star* article about a local charity opining that one person could buy groceries for one week for no more than \$31.50.

I decided to take that challenge. My strategy was to start as though I had an empty kitchen and to buy a combination of dairy and other protein, fresh and canned fruits and vegetables, beans, grains and cereals.

The result of my 2013 shopping spree at a local discount grocery was that I spent \$31.12 including tax. For that amount I was able to buy a gallon of milk, eggs, cottage cheese, whole wheat bread, oatmeal, corn meal, pinto beans, rice, a ham steak, canned tuna, carrots, fresh broccoli, canned spinach and green beans, oranges, raisins, canola oil and salt.

The same groceries from the same local discount grocery were purchased today for \$34.61. That is \$3.49 more, or roughly an **11 percent increase** over the 2013 prices.


