
Due to unseasonably warm weather the Ice Cream Social will be rescheduled at a later date.

Chef's Corner

Midwest Cole Slaw A side for your summer picnic

- 1/2 cup light mayonnaise
- 1/3 cup buttermilk
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 2 tbsps. white vinegar
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. celery seeds
- 2 packages (16 ounce bags) shredded coleslaw mix
- 2 scallions, thinly sliced

Combine mayonnaise, buttermilk, sugar, vinegar, salt and celery seeds in large bowl. Add shredded coleslaw mix and scallions. Mix well so all cabbage is covered with dressing.

Cover and refrigerate at least 4 hours or overnight, stirring occasionally. Before serving pour off excess liquid if desired.

Makes approximately 10 cups of slaw. One-half of the dressing is just right with one bag of coleslaw mix for a quick fresh vegetable at a family dinner. The extra dressing can be refrigerated for several days (the buttermilk keeps the dressing fresh longer than sweet milk).
