MUMMIES OF THE WORLD: THE EXHIBITION- THURSDAY, AUGUST 3 - Having been visited by over 1.6 million people nationwide, Mummies of the World: The Exhibition is one of the most popular museum exhibitions traveling North America, and it comes to Union Station this summer! Inside every mummy is a story waiting to be told. Through modern science and technology, their secrets are now revealed. THE SHOW ME STATE CAPITAL - TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 19 - We've got a full day planned in Jefferson City, starting with a visit to the Governor's Mansion. Built in 1871, The original three-story structure was built containing 13 bedrooms, no bathrooms or closets. In 1969, it was added to the U.S. National Register of Historic Places. Next you will visit the Missouri State Capitol building. The building, which covers three acres is literally a museum of public art, remarkable not only for its quality and abundance, but as a faithful reflection of the themes, events and people of Missouri. You will see a splendid collection of stained glass, murals, carvings and statuary portraying Missouri's history, legends and cultural achievements. You will learn about the Puppies on Parole program where selected offenders have the opportunity to become trainers to rescue dogs. You will tour the Missouri State Penitentiary and learn about the 168-year history of the Penitentiary including information on infamous inmates, the Riot of 1954, escape attempts and much more. You will be guided the oldest building still standing on the Missouri State Penitentiary site, built in 1868. Lunch is included today and you'll enjoy ice cream from Central Dairy, a Jefferson City tradition since the 1930's. Cost: \$115.00 includes motorcoach transportation, tours, and lunch. 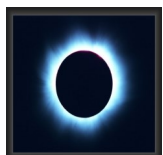

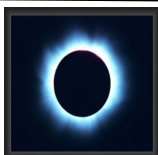
