DAY TRIPS

ST. JO FRONTIER CASINO - FRIDAY, AUGUST 3
You'll enjoy famous name slots and video poker machines plus many table games. A buffet lunch featuring pizza, pasta and salad is included. Cost: \$12.00 includes transportation. Bus departs at 8:45 a.m. and will return at approximately 3:30 p.m. Registration deadline: July 27th.

Your lunch is included at Andre's Rivaz at Hawthorne Plaza in Overland Park. Here you will find The General Store, The Container Store, Bag & Baggage, Elite Feet, and many more. Your final stop will be Trader's Joe's at Ward Parkway Shopping Center. Cost: \$37.00 includes transportation and lunch. LUNCH OUT AT GRAND STREET CAFÉ - THURSDAY, AUGUST 23 - Located just east of the Country Club Plaza, for over 25 years, locally owned and operated Grand Street has been a Kansas City favorite for its modern American cuisine. Cost: \$8.00 includes transportation. Lunch is on your own. Bus departs at 10:30 and will return at approximately 1:30 p.m. Registration deadline: August 10th.

ARABIA STEAMBOAT MUSEUM & CITY MARKET - WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 29 - When the mighty Steamboat Arabia sank near Kansas City on September 5, 1856, she carried 200 tons of mystery cargo. Lost for 132 years, its recovery in 1988 was like finding the King Tut's Tomb of the Missouri River. Remarkably preserved clothes, tools, guns, dishware and more. It is the largest single collection of pre-Civil War artifacts in the world. You will enjoy a guided tour before time on your own to shop and have lunch at the City Market. Cost: \$24.00 includes transportation and Arabia Museum. Bus departs at 9:45 a.m. and will return at approximately 2:30 p.m. Registration deadline: August 17th.

THE LAND OF OZ - FRIDAY, AUGUST 31 - You'll travel to Wamego, Kansas and visit the Oz Museum, home to one of the largest collections of privately-owned OZ memorabilia in the world. Start your journey in the Auntie Em's Gift Shop; pass through the screen door and into the technicolor world of Oz. Follow the path of the yellow brick road throughout the museum and view over 100 years of Oz history. Rare OZ artifacts such as original MGM 1939 movie production notes and props from the Broadway musical Wicked are also on display. You will also visit Oz Winery, tour the historic Columbian Theatre and visit the Prairie Village and Dutch Mill. A delicious lunch is included at the Friendship House. Cost: \$89.00 includes motor coach transportation, tours and lunch. Motor coach departs at 8:00 a.m. and will return at approximately 6:00 p.m. Registration deadline: August 2nd.

SUNFLOWERS & BUTTERFLIES - FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 7 - Your first stop will be Pendleton's Country Market, a certified Monarch Waystation outside of Lawrence. At the Butterfly Bio-Villa, you can get "eye-to-eye with a butterfly" and observe these marvelous animals close-up as they fly around the exhibit, feeding on nectar from garden flowers. Learn how the butterfly progresses from egg, to caterpillar, to chrysalis, to gorgeous winged creature, all in the course of a few weeks. You will enjoy lunch in Lawrence, then visit Grinter's Sunflower Farm where you'll see fields full of blooming sunflowers. Bring your camera for perfect photo opportunities and pick a sunflower to take home. They only ask that you leave a dollar for each one that you take. Cost: \$43.00 includes transportation, lunch and tour. Bus departs at 9:00 a.m. and will return at approximately 3:30 p.m. Registration deadline: August 24th.

PRAIRIE BAND CASINO - TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 11 - Your chance to win awaits on one of the 1,200 slot machines and a variety of table games. KANSAS CITY GANGSTER TOUR - THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 13 - Enjoy a gangster guided tour that will explore the locations connected to the seamier side of Kansas City life. You will get an intimate look at Kansas City's historic tough guys during the Pendergast "Political Machine". You'll be immersed in a melodramatic look at mob homes and hangouts, turf wars and infamous crimes like the Union Station massacre. Lunch is included at Garozzo's Restaurant. Cost: \$52.00 includes transportation, Gangster Tour and lunch. Bus departs at 9:00 a.m. and will return at approximately 1:30 p.m. Registration deadline: August 31st.

DINOSAURS REVEALED AT UNION STATION-FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 21 - Travel back 252 million years as we reveal dinosaurs that inhabited what is now North America. Lions, hippos, cheetah, chimps and more live in Africa, where you'll also see plains animals, such as zebra, giraffe, gazelles and more. Chimpanzees climb in a forest of trees. Baboons scavenge the ground for treats, while rhinos cover themselves in mud. A herd of six African elephants roam the acreage on the way to the Africa exhibit. In the Australia/Asia exhibit you'll find the Tiger Trail exhibit featuring orangutans, red pandas, the mystical-looking Lion-Tailed Macaques and Sumatran tigers. Here is where you'll also find Koala's, Wallaby and Kangaroos. Cost: \$18.00 includes transportation and zoo admission. The show is based on a true story about Patsy's friendship with a fan from Houston named Louise Seger, who befriended the star in a Texas honky-tonk in 1961, and continued a correspondence with Patsy until her death. The musical play, complete with down home country humor, true emotion and even some audience participation, includes many of Patsy's unforgettable hits such as CRAZY, I FALL TO PIECES, SWEET DREAMS, WALKING AFTER MIDNIGHT. Cost: \$47.00 includes transportation and dinner show.
