November 12

November 13 – Cape Girardeau

You will visit several different homes and museums that cover much of Cape Girardeau's history including the Glenn House, Cape River Heritage Museum Red House Interpretive Center, and St. Vincent's Church. (B,L,D)



November 14 - New Madrid, Missouri

As you board your Hop On-Hop Off deluxe motorcoach, stroll the 120-foot observation deck and view the 20mile-long Bessie Bend at the New Madrid Observation Deck. Shopping is next in downtown New Madrid. Then, see how culture is reflected in this ever-changing river town from the Mississippian Indian period at the New Madrid Historical Museum. (B,L,D)

November 15 – Memphis, Tennessee

Enjoy the day in Memphis, America's third largest inland port, famous for blues, barbeque and Elvis' Graceland. (B,L,D)

November 16 – Steamboating

Settle into a rocking chair and just let the scenery glide by. Or join in the fun of the numerous onboard activities. Your full day of leisurely steamboating on the Mississippi River sets the tone for an unforgettable vacation. (B,L,D)

<u>November 17 – Vicksburg, Mississippi</u> With sweeping views of the Mississippi River, Vicksburg perfectly blends Southern culture and heritage with exciting modern-day attractions. Stops along the way include the Old Court House Museum, which showcases thousands of artifacts from pre-Columbian times to Civil War implements, bringing exciting pieces of history to life. It also contains a unique gift shop with authentic Civil War relics. The Duff Green Mansion and Levee Street Depot Museum are also part of the history Vicksburg has to offer. (B,L,D)

<u>November 18 – St. Francisville, Louisiana</u> This quaint town located on the banks of the Mississippi River is your window to the past. With over 140 buildings on the National Register, beautiful plantation homes nestled in the rolling countryside, and beautiful main street shops, you'll find plenty to keep you on the go in St. Francisville. (B,L,D)

November 19 – New Orleans, Louisiana

The American Queen arrives in New Orleans near historic Jackson Square where you will say farewell to your ship. Upon arrival you will be met by a local guide and begin a comprehensive sightseeing excursion that will include many of the highlights of the city. At the conclusion of the tour you will check into either the Westin New Orleans Canal Place or the Hilton New Orleans Riverside. After time to freshen up, you will enjoy dinner at The Court of Two Sisters. (B,D)

November 20

Fly from New Orleans to Kansas City. Motorcoach transportation to Happy Rock Park is included. (B)
