Councilman Yarber stated: *"I was going to say hello to our members of the Arts Commission but I think the last one just left; and also to our Public Safety Telecommunicators. We still have a couple of members from the Animal Control Office, we are happy to see you and we are happy to see the students from the North Kansas City School District SAGE Program here earlier."*

Councilmember Suter stated: *"I just wanted to thank Mayor Pro Tem Garnos and his wife Lori, City Manager Scott Wingerson and his wife Michelle, Assistant City Manager Bob Baer and his wife Michelle, for joining me and Team Gladstone as we took on the Northland Regional Chambers Battle of the Brains Trivia contest. We held our own. We came in fourth place so that we didn't embarrass ourselves or anybody else, I don't think, we had a good time and then we learned to get to know each other a little bit better. I learned that the City Manager knows a lot about the State of Mississippi, the Assistant City Manager really knows a lot about the themes to television shows, and I learned that the Mayor Pro Tem is actually an expert in obscure Rock and Roll and beer. It was a good time. I also wanted to remind folks that there is an election on April 3 and we have two fine candidates running for re-election for the City Council so I hope people get out and cast a vote."*

Mayor Pro Tem Garnos stated: *"Thank you, Mayor. I have a couple of items. I wanted to thank Councilmember Suter and her husband; she didn't take enough credit for answering all of the movie and fine literature questions that the rest of us were baffled by. It was a freakish depth of knowledge of TV theme songs by our Assistant City Manager. We did beat all of the other Northland communities that had the guts to try to field a team. Second, we did have a meeting of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee last week but we were one member short of quorum so we were unable to elect officers or make an appointment to the Capital Improvements Committee. I also wanted to mention that we did have a member of the public attend and made a strong case for more pickle ball in Gladstone. I know the Community Center is working with her on the indoor pickle ball in the gymnasium. I wanted to congratulate you, Mayor Mallams, on your State of the Cities address at the Clay County Economic Development Council luncheon on Friday. You did a great job presenting our accomplishments here in Gladstone and frankly all the Northland communities really have a lot to be proud of. Finally, I wanted to remind everybody about the Municipal Election on Tuesday, we have not only a couple of candidates for City Council that I hear have some real potential, but there will be votes for School Board members. It's still an important election. Thank you, Mayor."*

Councilmember Carol Suter, Mayor Pro Tem Bill Garnos, and Mayor R.D. Mallams. (5-0). The Clerk read the Bill.

Councilman Yarber moved to accept the First Reading of Bill No. 18-13, waive the rule, and place the Bill on its Second and Final Reading. **Councilmember Moore** seconded. The Vote: "aye", Councilman Kyle Yarber, Councilmember Jean Moore, Councilmember Carol Suter, Mayor Pro Tem Bill Garnos, and Mayor R.D. Mallams. (5-0). The Clerk read the Bill.

Councilman Yarber moved to accept the Second and Final Reading of Bill No. 18-13, and enact the Bill as **Ordinance 4.420**. **Councilmember Moore** seconded.

Councilman Yarber stated: *"I'd like to make a quick little comment. I'm coming up on my first year of being on Council and I have to say this is the proudest action, this action by Council is my proudest moment of my first year. This is more than just putting out the welcome mat to say that everyone is welcome here. In having walked a lot of Gladstone and having met people, door to door meeting people, we are a lot more of a diverse community than people realize. This is a way for us to acknowledge that and provide basic protections that should be part of everyone's civil rights."*

Councilmember Suter stated: *"I have a comment. I appreciate the input from our Neighborhood Commission and I respect that often people think that we have policies mainly as a defense against law suits or some other negative action. I think that we have policies to also proclaim to the public what kind of community we are and want to be. I think the amendments before us do a good job of expressing the kind of community that we are and want to be."*

Councilmember Moore stated: *"Great comments. I applaud both of your comments."*

Mayor Pro Tem Garnos stated: *"I wanted to throw a comment out here also. Several months ago, we had a person who stood before this City Council, addressed the State Legislature's lack of guts to deal with this issue, and he said, simply, 'Gladstone is better than that.' To me, that was one of the single most persuasive and bravest things I've heard spoken from that podium. I am in support of this amendment and not because housing discrimination is a problem in Gladstone. It is not. This is a statement of principle and a statement of policy and nothing more. I also think these amendments are consistent with the Council's goals regarding community health and quality of life. This is not an issue that was on our radar screen. I want to thank Nate for putting the issue out there, and for his patience for us to work through this issue because he's right, 'Gladstone is better than that.' Thank you, Mayor."*
