Councilmember Spallo stated: "Thank you, Mayor. I was just very excited to see the work taking place at the DaVita Dialysis Center on Antioch Road. That is coming along pretty quickly. That was a nice surprise this past weekend as I drove by. I also had the opportunity to spend several hours lately at Happy Rock Park, taking advantage of our gorgeous trails out there and the facility itself. Hats off to the Parks and Recreation Department for all the hard work in preparing that park for all the busy times that are coming up. I absolutely love the new spur going up to North Brighton. It is so beautiful and my dog particularly loves it. That's all I have, Mayor."

**Councilman Garnos** stated: "Thank you, Mayor. I just wanted to mention we have a BZA next week as well as the Parks and Rec Advisory Board. I will fill you in on the excitement at our next Council meeting."

Mayor Pro Tem Mallams stated: "Thank you, Mayor. The Arts Commission met last week. I'll hold up this picture of this beautiful Monarch butterfly. Eleven feet in height. It is going to be installed at the South end of Linden Square with the butterfly, I believe, looking out into Linden Square. It's a wonderful Commission to work together. We came to a consensus on the project. It will be a temporary piece for a couple of years. Again, Director Merkey, good job leading that. Thank you."

Mayor Moore stated: "I wanted to say that I had the opportunity to attend both of the open houses for Fire Station #2 improvements. I want to extend my thanks to the architect for Wysocki and Director Hasty and Chief Daugherty and all the other Firefighters who attended those meetings. I think the public who did come got their questions answered and got to see the exciting proposal ahead for the Fire Station #2. Those were good meetings. I also had the opportunity last week with Austin and Scott and Councilman Frisby to take a tour of the Marriott. It is so cool. I was really blown away. It's going to be amazing and we are all going to really like it. I was very impressed with everything that they are doing and the progress that they

are making. They are on point, where they want to be, and they are actually half way there. It's going to be an exciting addition to downtown Gladstone."

Austin Greer, Assistant to the City Manager, Planner: "Good evening, Mayor and City Council. This may or may not surprise you, but as the City Code is currently written, once Site Plans are approved, they are approved indefinitely. Even without projects being actively pursued. Currently there are a handful of approved Site Plans throughout the city that are ten-plus years old and have not been actively pursued. Technically, developers could still implement those approved projects from many years ago without input of the current Planning Commission, current City Council, and current neighborhoods. As we all know, the world is a rapidly changing place and that residential neighborhoods and commercial corridors can look and feel much differently over the span of a couple of years. city staff believes that it is important to protect the health and safety of our neighborhoods and commercial corridors by passing an Ordinance that addresses the expiration of Site Plans that allows for more modern and up-to-date input by the Planning Commission, City Council, and neighborhoods. The Planning Commission unanimously approved this added Chapter to the City Code at their last meeting in February. Also, city staff recommends approval of this new Chapter. If you have any questions, I'll be more than happy to try to answer them. Thank you and that is all."



Dear Justin,

The Gladstone Area Chamber of Commerce, in cooperation with the City of Gladstone, is planning the 24<sup>th</sup> Annual Gladstone Summertime Bluesfest, scheduled for June 18 & 19.

In order to comply with the Outdoor Special Events Application, we respectfully request that the City of Gladstone temporarily suspend a few ordinances, as they apply to Bluesfest, including: noise prohibited, alcoholic beverages, prohibition of smoking on or within all public park grounds, drinking in public and temporary signs.

The Chamber would like to request that smoking be allowed at Bluesfest in two, specific designated areas of Oak Grove Park, including a fenced area east of the pond and a fenced area northwest of the park shelter (VIP area). An attached diagram outlines the specific areas requested. The Chamber will provide containers for disposal of smoking refuse and will be responsible for removing the refuse containers following Bluesfest.

The Chamber also requests allowing the sale of alcoholic beverages and drinking in public at the Bluesfest. A diagram of the park with the area in which alcoholic beverages will be permitted is attached. We also understand that next to each trash receptacle, a recycling receptacle is also required. We will comply fully with this request.

As Bluesfest is a live music festival, we request that the noise prohibited ordinance be waived during the hours of the event. Please note that Bluesfest organizers are very respectful of the ending time of 11 p.m. each evening, so as not to be too disruptive of the neighbors near Oak Grove Park.



Finally, we request that the temporary signage ordinances be waived, so that we may place up to twelve advertising banners throughout the city for a period of 2 weeks prior to the event. Banners will only be placed with permission of the property owners and will be removed within 48 hours following the event.

We respectfully request that the ordinances be suspended for all hours of operation of the Gladstone Summertime Bluesfest.


### Financial Report for 8 Months Ending February 28, 2021


#### **GENERAL FUND**

#### **General Fund Revenues**

Total revenues for the General Fund through 8 months or 67% of this fiscal year are \$14,588,569 compared to total budgeted revenues for the year of \$21,276,894 or 69% of budgeted revenue. Property tax receipts are \$3,607,796, \$165,047 or 5% over amounts received at the same time as the previous year. Sales tax on a cash basis is \$2,924,576 or \$217,986 (8%) over last year. The 2019 sales tax (1/2 cent sales tax passed in 2019) is \$1,175,282. Gross receipts taxes are \$1,974,028, down 8% from last year mostly due to a decrease in electric gross receipts. License and Permits revenues are \$546,410, down 1% or \$7,625. Intergovernmental revenue is \$927,422, or \$7,986 less than the previous year. Charges for Services are \$1,714,613, down 25% or \$579,401 compared to the previous year due to senior and recreation activities. Fines and Forfeitures have decreased 25% from the same time last year to \$331,797. Miscellaneous Revenue is \$602,145, down \$69,074 mainly due to a decrease in interest and rental income. The General Fund received debt proceeds from the 2020 COP in the amount of \$570,000 for the purchase of a new fire truck. Transfers for the year have totaled \$214,500 and are comparable to the previous year.









Expenditures through 8 months or 67% of this fiscal year amounted to \$13,607,625 or 64% of FY21 budgeted expenditures of \$21,266,143. This indicates that actual expenditures are 5% or \$950,352 more than last year's expenditures of \$12,943,420. General Administration expenditures are \$858,505, an increase of \$18,525 or 2% due to contractual payments. Finance expenditures have decreased \$34,806 to \$926,010 due to changes in personnel. Public Safety expenditures are \$6,359,403, an increase of \$231,588 due to personnel costs. Public Works expenditures are \$1,541,573 or 4% more than the prior year due to increases in personnel costs and the contractual obligations. Community Development expenditures are \$485,354, a decrease of \$49,801 due to the timing of contractual obligations and staffing changes. Parks & Recreation expenditures are \$1,224,097, down 37% or \$705,324 from the same time last year due to decreases in Senior Activities and staffing changes. Non-Departmental expenditures are \$633,032 or \$27,798 less than the previous year due to personnel changes. Payments for debt have increased \$125,398 to 347,917 due to the 2019 Lease Purchase and 2020 COP. Capital Outlay is \$615,241, mainly due to the purchase of a new fire truck. Transfers have increased \$505,005 to \$616,493 due to the sales tax transfer for the 2020A COP debt service. Current revenues exceed current expenditures in the amount of \$980,945.


#### **COMBINED WATER AND SEWERAGE SYSTEM FUND**

Total budgeted revenues for the fiscal year are \$14,557,595. Total revenues through 8 months or 67% of this fiscal year, amounted to \$10,067,573 or 69% of FY21 budgeted revenues. Operating revenues are up \$268,424 (2%) from last year due to increased water and sewer consumption.







Total budgeted expenditures for the fiscal year are \$14,557,595. Total expenditures through 8 months or 67% of this fiscal year amounted to \$9,109,013 or 63% of FY21 budgeted expenditures. Production expenditures are down \$162,241 to \$763,827 due to the timing of contractual payments (lime sludge). Operations division expenditures are \$533,177, a decrease of \$4,605. Sewer division expenditures have decreased \$94,136 to \$181,828 due to the timing of sewer line maintenance and changes in personnel. Non-departmental expenditures are \$6,027,276, up \$1,845,703 due to the increase in water and sewage consumption. Payments for debt have increased from the previous year due to the 2020A COP to \$1,018,522. Capital outlay has is 534,383, a decrease of \$370,846 due to the timing of water line replacements. Current revenues exceed current expenditures by \$958,559.





### COMMUNITY CENTER AND PARKS TAX FUND






Total budgeted revenues for the fiscal year are \$5,151,584. Total revenues through 8 months or 67% of this fiscal year, amounted to \$3,594,357 or 70% of FY21 budgeted revenues. Sales tax received is \$594,128, up 3% from the previous year. Intergovernmental revenue (Charge to the North Kansas City School District for the natatorium) is \$700,000. Charges for Services are \$522,781, down 31% or \$235,065. Revenue from facility rental is \$63,588, down 60%. Miscellaneous revenue is \$6,160, down 11% from prior year. Transfers to the fund are 777,700 with \$877,700 budgeted. Debt proceeds for the fund are \$930,000. Equity transfer budgeted for the fiscal year is \$763,244 to offset the anticipated revenue loss.







Total budgeted expenditures for the fiscal year are \$5,150,964. Total expenditures through 8 months or 67% of this fiscal year amounted to \$2,461,416 or 48% of FY21 budgeted expenditures. Community Center expenditures have decreased 5% from the same time last year to \$608,297 due to contractual obligations. The Natatorium expenditures are \$537,525, an increase of \$17,802 from the same time last year due to increased personnel costs. Outdoor Pool expenditures are \$77,685, \$35,234 below the previous year. Non-departmental is \$115,913, an increase from last year of \$4,628. Capital outlay is \$35,000 less than the same time last year. Debt is comparable to the prior year. Current revenues exceed current expenditures by \$1,132,942.

#### PUBLIC SAFETY SALES TAX FUND



Total budgeted revenues for the fiscal year are \$957,600. Total revenues through 8 months or 67% of this fiscal year amounted to \$618,345 or 65% of FY21 budgeted revenues. Sales tax on a cash basis is up 3%. Miscellaneous revenue is \$24,545, \$20,333 more than the prior year due to the sale of assets.





Total budgeted expenditures for the fiscal year are \$955,769. Total expenditures through 8 months or 67% of this fiscal year are \$458,193 or 48% of the FY21 budgeted expenditures. Law division is \$334,117, up 11% from the same time last year due to increased personnel cost. Non-Departmental is \$21,834, compared to \$32,507 during the previous year. The decrease is due to the timing of equipment maintenance. Capital outlay is \$76,031 compared to \$66,410 during the previous year. Debt is comparable to the previous year. Current revenue over expense for the fund is \$160,153.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A FIFTH AMENDMENT TO THE COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT FOR SEWER SERVICE BETWEEN THE CITY OF KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI, AND GLADSTONE, MISSOURI, REVISING THE FEE SCHEDULE ASSOCIATED WITH THE DISPOSAL OF LIME SLUDGE, AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE AGREEMENT ON BEHALF OF THE CITY.

#### Legislative Findings

- 1. The City of Gladstone, Missouri, entered into a Cooperative Agreement for Sewer Service with the City of Kansas City, Missouri, on December 7, 2000 ("Cooperative Agreement"), which established a fee schedule for the acceptance of lime sludge from the Gladstone Water Treatment Plant for five (5) years; and
- 2. The City of Gladstone, Missouri, and the City of Kansas City, Missouri, entered into a First Amendment to the Cooperative Agreement on June 24, 2005, for an additional five (5) year period; and
- 3. The City of Gladstone, Missouri, and the City of Kansas City, Missouri, entered into a Second Amendment to the Cooperative Agreement on November 11, 2010, for an additional five (5) year period; and
- 4. The City of Gladstone, Missouri, and the City of Kansas City, Missouri, entered into a Third Amendment to the Cooperative Agreement on June 29, 2016, for an additional three (3) year period; and
- 5. The City of Gladstone, Missouri, and the City of Kansas City, Missouri, entered into a Fourth Amendment to the Cooperative Agreement on June 25, 2018, for an additional two (2) year period; and
- 6. The parties wish to enter into a Fifth Amendment to the Cooperative Agreement for an additional three (3) years.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GLADSTONE, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

THAT, the City of Gladstone hereby approves the Fifth Amendment to the Cooperative Agreement for Sewer Service Between the City of Kansas City, Missouri, and Gladstone, Missouri, which amends the terms of Article V, Section H regarding the fees associated with Kansas City's acceptance of lime sludge from the Gladstone Water Treatment Plant for an additional three (3) year period; and

**FURTHER, THAT**, the City Manager of the City of Gladstone, Missouri, is hereby authorized to execute the Fifth Amendment with the City of Kansas City, Missouri on behalf of the City.
