The project consists of roadway improvements to NE 76<sup>th</sup> Street from N. Oak Trafficway to N. Brooklyn and all related appurtenances including the replacement of an 8-inch water main from N. Troost to N. Woodland.

<u>Budget Discussion</u>: Funds are budgeted in the amount of \$2,200,000 from the TST Fund and \$450,000 from the CWSS Fund. The total project cost will be offset with a \$1,200,000 grant from the Federal Highway Administration Surface Transportation Program. Ongoing costs are estimated to be \$1,500 annually. Previous years' funding was \$N.A. The Engineer's Estimate for the project is \$2,517,361.90.

Gunter Construction is a company based in Kansas City, KS that has been in business for a total of 30 years. Gunter Construction has completed several projects for the City over the past few years, including the NW 72<sup>nd</sup> & N. The project includes the installation of 550 LF of storm sewer ranging in size from 36" to 42" and related appurtenances and is located directly downstream of the NE 76<sup>th</sup> Street Improvements.

<u>Budget Discussion</u>: Funds are budgeted in the amount of \$225,000 from the CIST Fund. The total project cost will be offset with an \$80,000 contribution from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources Stormwater Grant Program. Ongoing costs are estimated to be \$500 annually. Previous years' funding was \$N.A. The Engineer's Estimate for the project is \$225,155.

#### Public/Board/Staff Input:

Site Rite Construction is a company based in Kansas City, MO. They have completed projects for the City in the past including the N. Euclid Sanitary Sewer Improvements (\$800,000) in 2010 and the 5310 Old Pike Road Stormwater Improvements (\$37,000) in 2012. Site Rite is also the proposed utility subcontractor to the low bidder on the NE 76<sup>th</sup> Street Improvements (Gunter Construction). 
