



AN ORDINANCE DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE GLADSTONE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD ON TUESDAY, APRIL 4, 2023, AS CERTIFIED BY THE CLAY COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTION COMMISSIONERS; DECLARING THAT CANDIDATES LES SMITH AND TINA SPALLO HAVE BEEN ELECTED TO THREE YEAR TERMS ON THE GLADSTONE CITY COUNCIL AND DECLARING THAT THE IMPOSITION OF A SALES TAX ON NON-MEDICAL ADULT USE MARIJUANA AT A RATE OF THREE PERCENT HAS BEEN APPROVED BY THE VOTERS OF THE CITY OF GLADSTONE, MISSOURI.
