Mayor Moore opened the Regular City Council Meeting Monday, August 10, 2026 at 7:30 pm.

Mayor Moore stated that all Councilmembers were present and there was a quorum.

The Agenda was approved as published.

Councilman Nave reported on the successful AJ Barn ribbon cutting, highlighting strong community turnout and the significance of the long-awaited addition to the historic site. He mentioned a Resolution on the Agenda to provide additional equipment for the Fire Department and commended Chief Desautels and Fire/EMS staff for their service and efforts to secure grant funding, allowing the equipment to be obtained with no impact on the City's general budget.

Councilman Smith expressed agreement with Councilman Nave's remarks regarding the AJ Barn ribbon cutting event.

Councilmember Spallo encouraged continued community support for Firehouse Subs, noting that proceeds help fund new firefighting equipment. She announced the Sunflower Field Festival on Saturday, August 15, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at Big Shoal Farm, featuring pick-your-own and pre-cut flowers, an artists' fair, children's crafts and games, and noted that favorable weather is anticipated.

Mayor Moore thanked volunteers who participated in the most recent Glad Green Team cleanup along North Oak from NE 72nd Street to Englewood Road, noting a turnout of about 15 participants.

Justin Sanborn-McMeen, 503 NE Maple Drive, Oak View, commended the Gladstone outdoor pool as an important resource for local families, including those with special needs, while raising concerns about facility maintenance, safety conditions, aquatics staff management, and training. He cited specific safety and lifeguard performance issues and noted previous efforts to bring the concerns to staff and the Mayor. **Mayor Moore** stated that the concerns had been shared with staff and had been addressed.

Subject: Change Order No. 6, NE 76th Terrace Storm Drainage & Parking Improvements, Project CP2531

Background: The contract for Project CP2531 was awarded to Fleshman Construction, Inc., authorized by Resolution R-25-07. Change Order No. 1 (R-25-23) expanded the scope of work to include the installation of three (3) pressure reducing valves to reduce system pressures in the southeast part of the City. Change Order No. 3 (R-25-54) further increased the scope of work to include additional curb and sidewalk replacement in the vicinity of City Hall and the Community Center. Change Order 4 (R-26-06) increased the scope of work to include an RCB extension at 6752 N. Park. Change Order 5 (R-26-20) provided for additional concrete work in the vicinity of the Community Center. Change Order 6 added the emergency storm sewer repair on Old Pike Road and irrigation and sod at the AJ Farm. Change Order 7 (R-26-48) added centrifugally cast concrete lining to the work in Change Order 7. Change Order 8 incorporates a pergola and concrete area at the AJ Farm Barn. Two bids were received for this work (Centric Construction and Fleshman Construction). Fleshman was the low bidder.

Background: The project includes the installation of 50 linear feet of 6' x 4' Reinforced Concrete Box (RCB) between 6748 and 6752 N. Park. The project was originally planned in 2002 but was subsequently canceled due to the inability to acquire the necessary easements. At the request of area residents, the City revisited the project, and the necessary easements have since been acquired. Construction was previously awarded to Fleshman Construction by Resolution R-26-06.
