WHEREAS, the City Council desires to adopt the Vision Statement for the benefit of the residents and business owners of the City, the development community, and staff.



SUBJECT: Downtown Gladstone

At the last City Council meeting study session, staff presented information related to a proposed vision statement for the downtown area. At that meeting a notebook containing various information related to Downtown Gladstone was provided and the vision statement discussed.

Periodically, staff requests that the City Council consider the Downtown Gladstone vision statement. This statement provides general guidance to the public, developers and staff.

Early vision concepts began to emerge during Gladstone on the Move. These ideas for vision were reflected in early Village Center Master Planning efforts. These reflections were refined in the 2008 Comprehensive Plan. The Comprehensive Plan and associated regulatory changes helped provide and environment for Linden Square, Dentistry for Children, Gladstone 18 and The Heights.

Staff has attempted to reflect City Council comments in the vision statement contained in the proposed resolution. If you should wish to discuss this matter in great detail or desire additional information, please advise.
