KC Communities for All Ages Resolution

In 2012 the City of Gladstone participated in Phase 1 of the First Suburbs Coalition, KC Communities for All Ages, and Mid-America Regional Council's Communities For All Ages Initiative. This was funded by a grant from the Pfizer Foundation and Grant Makers in Aging. This phase was comprised of four (4) First Suburb Communities, two (2) from Kansas; City of Mission and City of Prairie Village, and two (2) from Missouri; City of Raytown and City of Gladstone. These four communities worked together and produced a toolkit for cities entitled "Making Your Community Work for All Ages". This phase also produced an idea book entitled "Home - Communities For All Ages – Idea Book".

These same four (4) communities participated in Phase 2. This phase was also funded by a grant from the Pfizer Foundation and Grant Makers in Aging. This phase assisted communities and the region in establishing protocols for applying the Communities for All Ages toolkit and Idea Book recommendations. These four (4) communities provided advice and insight in applying these practices to first suburban communities. Each community had a taskforce consisting of elected officials, staff, and citizens that discussed the Community for All Ages strategies and setting priorities for our community; including consideration of implementation strategies. From this phase a checklist was established "Become a Community for All Ages - A Checklist to help you become age friendly".

The First Suburbs Coalition, KC Communities for All Ages, and Mid-America Regional Council have been awarded an additional grant funded by the Pfizer Foundation and Grant Makers in Aging for Phase 3. This phase is the last phase to be funded by the Pfizer Foundation and Grant Makers in Aging and will address the recognition program for the Communities for All Ages initiative. The City of Gladstone has committed to be the pilot community, as you are aware, the Mayor back in August signed a letter of commitment. I have enclosed a copy of this letter for your convenience.

At the September 22, 2014 City Council Open Study Session, Cathy Boyer-Shesol from the Mid-America Regional Council and Project Manager for KC Communities for All Ages presented an update to the City Council on the Communities for All Ages initiative. After her presentation, the City Council was informed that a resolution would be forthcoming on this initiative. Please find attached, for the City Council's consideration, a resolution supporting and promoting the First Suburbs Coalition, KC Communities for All Ages, and Mid-America Regional Councils' Communities for All Ages Initiative.
