WHEREAS, proposals were solicited for the purchase of one 2015 (or newer) Chevrolet G4500 ambulance chassis with new, custom manufactured ambulance body/module (patient compartment) with specified equipment, the proposal from American Response Vehicles (ARV) is recommended.

THAT, on or after July 1, 2015, the City Manager, be and he is hereby authorized to enter into a purchasing agreement with American Response Vehicles (ARV) in Columbia, Missouri, for the purchase of one (1) 2015 (or newer) Chevrolet G4500 ambulance chassis with new, custom manufactured ambulance body/module (patient compartment) including specified loose equipment for the purchase price as indicated:

FURTHER, that funds for such purpose will be authorized in the General Fund of the FY2016 Annual Budget.

Re: NEW AMBULANCE PURCHASE

The City Council approved the Fiscal Year 2016 Budget at their regular City Council Meeting on June 8, 2015. Included in the budget is funding for a new ambulance. The funds for the purchase of the new ambulance originate from a combination of a grant provided by the developers of the Linden Woods Project (\$100,000.00) and reserves set aside for ambulance acquisitions established with a property tax approved by voters in 2005 (\$30,000.00 per year). A total of \$190,000.00 is available from these sources for the purchase of a new ambulance.

Specifications for a new ambulance were developed by Deputy Chief Robert Baer and staff from the Fire/EMS Division in the Public Safety Department and published in a Request for Proposal (RFP) in March, 2015. Quotes/Bids from five (5) vendors were received in response to the RFP however, all of the bids exceeded the funds available. After a review of the bids and the specifications outlined in the RFP, it was decided to contact all vendors who submitted bids/quotes and ask them to resubmit amended bids without the cardiac monitor and without the WatchGuard camera system however, retain they were asked to keep all remaining details and specifications in the RFP in the amended bid/quote. Each vendor submitted their amended bids as follows:

- ESS (Emergency Services Supply) representing Osage Ambulances \$198,365.00
- Firefox Rescue Equipment representing McCoy-Miller Ambulances \$193,333.00
- American Response Vehicles representing AEV Ambulances \$169,597.00
- Taylor Made Ambulance \$161,697.00
- Feld Fire representing Wheeled Coach Ambulances \$187,727.00

As indicated in my earlier memorandum (MJH 15-18 dated April 29, 2015) the review of the proposals revealed all vendors complied with the bid specifications with the exception of Taylor Made Ambulance. The proposal from Taylor Made Ambulance contained two significant exceptions: (1) windows in the patient compartment were not recessed into the door panels and (2) no information was submitted regarding crash tests "similar in scope to testing performed by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and the Insurance Institute for Automobile Safety to verify the crashworthiness of passenger vehicles." The proposal from Taylor Made Ambulance was rejected due to the exceptions to the bid specifications noted.

Upon review of the remaining proposals, the bid submitted by American Response Vehicles was the lowest price quote and met the specifications outlined in the RFP. It is recommended the city accept the bid/quote from American Response Vehicles for delivery of a new ambulance with custom patient compartment (module), and specified loose equipment for the total purchase price of \$169,597.00. Deputy Chief Baer will work with City Attorney Randall Thompson to complete the details and final form of a purchasing agreement.

A resolution authorizing you to sign an Ambulance Purchasing Agreement from American Response Vehicles on or after July 1st, 2015 will be on the June 22, 2015 City Council Meeting Agenda. It is anticipated you will sign an Ambulance Purchasing Agreement on July 1, 2015 and once the agreement is executed, construction will commence on the new ambulance. Delivery of the new ambulance will be 120 to 180 days after receipt of the order. The new ambulance should be delivered, according to the terms of the purchasing agreement, no later than December 31, 2015. Please advise if you have any questions or need additional information.

Over the past several months, Battalion Chief Atkins, P/FF Wessel, P/FF Minor and I, have worked within a committee to develop specifications for the purchase of a new ambulance. After speaking with personnel, it was clear that a Type III chassis was the preference of most paramedics.

After developing the specifications, they were published and sent out to multiple ambulance manufacturers. On March 17, 2015, at 10:00 Hrs, the bids were opened by Glen Whitton in the Council Chambers. The following is a list of vendors and the bids provided:

ESS (Emergency Services Supply) representing Osage Ambulances: \$239,189.00

FireFox Rescue Equipment representing McCoy Miller Ambulances: \$246,614.00

American Response Vehicles representing AEV Ambulances: \$212,884.00

Taylor Made representing Taylor Made Ambulances: \$202,245.00

Feld Fire representing Wheeled Coach Ambulances: \$236,964.00

Although Taylor Made submitted the lowest bid, there were two (2) major exceptions taken from the published bid specifications.

- 1) Windows were not recessed into the door panels as specified; rather a window insert was used.
- 2) No safety crash data was supplied by the vendor as specified.

Because all bids exceeded the \$190,000.00 allocated for this project, the Zoll X-Series cardiac monitor, valued at approximately \$33,637, The Watchguard forward facing camera system, valued at approximately \$6,500, and a pre-build trip for two committee members to the factory, valued at \$2,700, were removed from the bids.

All vendors, who had submitted bids, were notified on April 30, 2015 and asked to resubmit their bids based on the removal of the above-mentioned equipment. As a result, the following bids were obtained:

ESS (Emergency Services Supply) representing Osage Ambulances: \$198,365.00

FireFox Rescue Equipment representing McCoy Miller Ambulances: \$193,333.00

American Response Vehicles representing AEV Ambulances: \$169,597.00

Taylor Made representing Taylor Made Ambulances: \$161,697.00

Feld Fire representing Wheeled Coach Ambulances: \$187,727.00

After removing the costs of the additional items from all submitted bids, it was determined that the bid submitted by American Response Equipment, representing American Emergency Vehicles (AEV), was within the allotted funding and also in compliance with the specifications published by the City. Therefore, it is my recommendation that the City of Gladstone purchase the ambulance from American Response Equipment in the amount of \$169,597.00

Re: NEW AMBULANCE PURCHASE

During the process of reviewing the Linden Woods Project in 2014, the developers agreed to provide \$100,000.00 as a grant to help fund a new ambulance for the City of Gladstone. These funds were placed in escrow with an agreement to utilize these funds before December 2017. In 2003, a citizen-based strategic planning process, "Gladstone on the Move," recommended increasing property tax on Gladstone property owners and setting aside \$30,000.00 each year from this tax in a reserve account to be used to acquire new ambulances as needed. This increase was approved by the City Council and Gladstone voters in 2005.

It is anticipated this reserve account will have a balance of \$90,000.00 in Fiscal Year 2016. It was decided to combine the grant funds from the Linden Woods Project with the reserve funds making \$190,000.00 available in Fiscal Year 2016 to purchase a new ambulance. This acquisition was included in the FY 2016 Budget presentation to the City Council at their Study Session on April 27, 2015. It is anticipated this will be included in the final budget when presented to the City Council in June, 2015.

In preparation for this acquisition, earlier this year, Deputy Chief Robert Baer assembled the following personnel in the Fire/EMS Division to research and create detailed specifications for the purchase of a new ambulance: Battalion Chief Brett Atkins, Paramedic/Firefighter Ellie Minor, and Paramedic/Firefighter Travis Wessel. These individuals, along with Deputy Chief Baer, comprised the Ambulance Specification Committee and they completed their work in February which is documented in the eighty-seven page Request for Proposal (RFP) entitled, "Invitation to Submit

Competitive Bids for Ambulance and Equipment." Deputy Chief Baer managed the process of creating the specifications for the new ambulance with equipment and partnered with Glen Whitten, Construction Contracts Administrator in the Finance Department, to advertise and receive competitive bids for the construction of a new ambulance with equipment.

Mr. Whitten published notice of the bid in the Kansas City Star newspaper and Public Information Coordinator Richard King ensured the bid announcement was posted on the city's web site on March 1, 2015. The announcement included a notice the sealed bids received would be opened at 10:00 AM on March 17, 2015. Deputy Chief Baer sent information on the bid process to the following ambulance manufacturers: Wheeled Coach Industries, Road Rescue Inc., Horton Emergency Vehicles, Medtech Ambulance Corporation, McCoy-Miller Emergency Vehicles, American Emergency Vehicles (AEV), and Osage Industries.

Quotes/bids were received from the following five companies:

- ESS (Emergency Services Supply) representing Osage Ambulances \$239,189.00
- Firefox Rescue Equipment representing McCoy-Miller Ambulances \$246,614.00
- American Response Vehicles representing AEV Ambulances \$212,884.00
- Taylor Made Ambulance \$202,245.00
- Feld Fire representing Wheeled Coach Ambulances \$236,964.00

Deputy Chief Baer and members of the Ambulance Specification Committee reviewed each of the proposals; analyzing price quotes and identifying any exceptions to the bid specifications. Each of the bids received exceeded the amount budgeted for this acquisition and consideration was given on how to bring the cost of the new ambulance within the funds available. Deputy Chief Baer reviewed the equipment included in the RFP to determine what could be deleted.

The review of the proposals revealed all vendors complied with the bid specifications with the exception of Taylor Made Ambulance. The proposal from Taylor Made Ambulance contained two significant exceptions: (1) windows in the patient compartment were not recessed into the door panels and (2) no information was submitted regarding crash tests "similar in scope to testing performed by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and the Insurance Institute for Automobile Safety to verify the crashworthiness of passenger vehicles." The proposal from Taylor Made Ambulance was rejected due to the exceptions to the bid specifications noted.

Upon review of the remaining proposals, the bid submitted by American Response Vehicles was the lowest price quote. Upon consultation with you, it was decided to delete the Zoll cardiac monitor and Watchguard, Inc. camera system from the list of equipment on the bid specifications. On Wednesday, April 29, 2015, Deputy Chief Baer sent notifications (via email) to all five companies submitting proposals informing them of the equipment being removed from the bid specifications and offering them the opportunity to submit a revised proposal within seven days.

Deputy Chief Baer contacted Ned Clifton, Sales Manager for American Response Vehicles to review their proposal. Pursuant to that review, Chief Baer recommended deleting the Zoll cardiac monitor (\$33,637.00), the Watchguard, Inc. camera system (\$6,500.00), a "pre-inspection" trip for two ambulance committee members to the manufacturing plant (\$2,700.00), and the IDPH front sway bar (\$450.00). A total of \$43,287.00 was deleted from the American Response Vehicles

proposal. The final price for delivery of a new ambulance, meeting all other bid specifications and equipment requirements, is \$169,597.00.

We are awaiting revised proposals from the other vendors however, we have no reason to expect any other bid will be lower than the final price offered from American Response Vehicles. Deputy Chief Baer has recommended accepting the proposal from American Response Vehicles and I concur with his recommendation.

With your approval, once the Fiscal Year 2016 Budget is approved by the City Council, a resolution authorizing you to sign an Ambulance Purchasing Agreement from American Response Vehicles on or after July 1st, 2015 will be on the June 22, 2015 City Council Meeting Agenda. It is anticipated you will sign an Ambulance Purchasing Agreement on July 1, 2015 and once the agreement is executed, construction of the new ambulance will commence. Delivery of the new ambulance will be 120 to 180 days after receipt of the order. AEV shall not be responsible for cost incurred by the owner for correction of deficiencies covered by this warranty unless express authorization for such expenses has been granted in writing by AEV. Gratuitous settlements by AEV of alleged defects not within the scope of this warranty do not constitute admissions of warranty coverage, nor impose an obligation on AEV to make any such settlements.

This warranty applies only to the original buyer. Is valid only as long as the body is mounted on the original chassis or the body has been remounted by **AEV** or by an authorized agent of **AEV**. This warranty is accepted by the buyer in lieu of all other warranties express or implied, including, but not limited to, any implied warranty of merchantability or purpose, and of all other obligations or liabilities on the part of **AEV**. AEV Seven Year Conversion Warranty

American Emergency Vehicles (AEV) warrants to the owner of each vehicle that all items of AEV's manufacture will be free from defects in material and workmanship for a period of seven (7) years / 70,000 miles, whichever shall occur first. The warranty shall begin on the date such vehicle is delivered to the first purchaser. During this warranty period, AEV will remedy by repair or replacement, at AEV's option, any item of AEV's manufacture which AEV's inspection determines to be defective in materials or workmanship. Such repair or replacement will be performed either at the AEV plant or by AEV Field Service Technicians in the field, or by an AEV authorized regional Service Center, at AEV's option.

All warranty claims must be submitted to and approved by AEV prior to repair.

Exclusions from warranty: This warranty shall not apply to:

- A. Any parts or products becoming defective as the result of the Owner's negligence, accident, or other casualty.
- Defects or failure resulting from Owner's failure to provide normal maintenance, such as (but not limited to) lubrication, tightening belts and bolts, cleaning coils, loss of refrigerant, drier replacement, improper voltage or electrical connections as a result of field installations.
- C. Improper repairs, alterations or installations performed by persons or firms other than AEV.

The foregoing warranty is completely void if the body, chassis and/or truck has sustained damages as the result of a wreck, abuse or other occurrence which would leave permanent latent defects, or if the AEV serial number has been removed. Normal use and service under the terms of this warranty shall specifically exclude the use of the vehicle beyond its gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR) as defined under the National Traific and Motor Vehicle Safety Act or other applicable law.

AEV Modular Exterior and Finish Warranty

I. WARRANTY

American Emergency Vehicles (AEV) warrants that the paint which is supplied by Sikkens/ Alzo Nobel and applied by AEV shall be free from any defects as described in section IV hereof during the warranty period as specified therein.

II. WARRANTY PERIOD

- A. The warranty shall commence on the date a customer accepts delivery of a new vehicle painted by AEV.
- B: The Warranty period for a covered vehicle shall terminate seven (7) years or seventythousand (70,000) miles after the date on which the vehicle is delivered, whichever occurs first

III. SCOPE OF WARRANTY

- A. AEV's obligation under this warranty is limited to a refund of reasonable costs or direct labor and replaced products of the Paint System. AEV Dealer or customer shall provide AEV with a breakdown of the estimated costs in order to obtain or get approval to proceed before starting on any repairs. Repairs not authorized in advance will not be accepted for coverage by this warranty, and will not be subject to payment by AEV or Akzo Nobel.
- B. The obligation of AEV in connection with said costs shall be to repair the unit at AEV's facility or at an authorized Akzo Nobel Coatings certified repair center, with the transportation costs paid by the customer.
- C. In no event shall AEV be liable for any special, indirect, incidental or consequential damages, even if AEV has been advised of the possibility thereof, including but not limited to lost profits, lost revenues, inconvenience, lost of time, failure to realize expected savings, or other commercial or economic losses of any kind.

IV. NOTICE

The warranty provided herein shall cover and extend to the following properties of the Paint System:

- A. Loss of adhesion of the Point System resulting in rusting (less than rust grade 5, ASTM D 610-85).
- B. Cracking of the Paint System (as set forth in ASTM D 661-86).
- C. Loss of adhesion of any element of the Paint System resulting in appearance below standards set out in ASTM D 1654-79A, table 2, rating 6 or lower.
- D. Fading or loss of gloss below the standard set out in ASTM D 659-86, value 4 or lower.
- E. Corrosion warranty 36 months.

V. EXCLUSIONS FROM THE WARRANTY

Defects in the Paint System arising as a result of or out of he following are excluded from coverage under this warranty:

- Mechanical abrasion or external foreign object damage.
- B. Application, or removal of, stickers, decals or lettering.
- Defects caused by abnormal environmental conditions, including acid rain and industrial fallout.
