WHEREAS, a proposal was received for the emergency replacement of the two stage compressor in the Community Center Heating, Ventilating and Air Conditioning System, and that proposal by The Waldinger Corporation in the amount of \$34,884.68 has been determined by the Director of Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts to be a fair proposal.

RE: Emergency Community Center HVAC Repairs

During the storms that occurred the evening of Saturday, June 17th, the power to the community center was partially lost. During this partial loss of power, many issues inside the center occurred resulting in significant damage to some of the HVAC units and other smaller items such as a commercial freezer and projector. The HVAC units that cool the administration, fitness and banquet areas were all repaired within a few days following the incident. However, one of the two compressors in the large unit that cools the natatorium was damaged beyond repair. Due to the significance of this unit to maintinain ambient temperatures of the pool area, a new compressor was ordered and installed on July 17<sup>th</sup>. The cost to repair this single compressor to make the Natatorium HVAC unit fully functional was \$34,884.38.

Due to the total cost of all damages, we are working with our HVAC contractor, Waldinger, and KCPL to submit an insurance claim.
