<u>Subject:</u> City of Gladstone support of the celebration of America's 250th Anniversary in 2026 and the Clay County 250 Citizen Challenge.

Background: On September 17, 2025, Constitution Day, Clay County 250 proudly announced the launch of the Clay County 250 Citizen Challenge, a groundbreaking civic engagement program designed to inspire citizens of all ages to practice democracy in everyday life. This innovative program recognizes participants for completing meaningful civic tasks as well as the chance to earn points toward certificates, commemorative challenge coins, and public honors. The Clay County 250 Citizen Challenge is the first program of its kind in the nation, connecting the upcoming 250th anniversary of the United States with the lived experience of active citizenship today. The Challenge includes simple yet powerful tasks: reading the Declaration of Independence and Constitution, writing letters to public officials, attending civic meetings, thanking public servants, and serving the community. Each task completed earns participants points, which lead to recognition and the presentation of challenge coins. The program has been developed in close partnership with local schools. Teachers across Clay County are already preparing to enroll their classrooms.
