<u>No Bake Cherry Cake</u> – Low carb/low fat recipe Ingredients Pre

1 (10 inch) prepared Angel Food Cake

1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups fat free (skim) milk

1 cup light sour cream

1 pkg. (4 serving size) fat-free/sugar-free

Vanilla instant pudding mix

1 can (21 ounces) light Cherry Pie filling

Preparation:

- Tear or cut cake into bite-sized pieces; press into a 11x17 inch baking dish (I used a 9x12 and cut back on amounts).
- Combine milk, sour cream and pudding mix in medium bowl; beat 2 minutes or until thickened. Spread over the cake
- Spoon cherry pie filling evenly over the top of the cake. Chill until ready to serve.
